GREETING FROM THE HEAD

Our School Priorities 2023 to 2024

In last week's newsletter I promised to share with you some areas of key priorities that we are working on during this academic year. I have previously shared with parents the structure of our leadership team where all colleagues lead on specific aspects of school development. In 2023 to 2024, working as a senior team alongside all staff and governors, we are seeking to:

- Improve the quality of the curriculum focusing on key areas of reading, accessibility and quality-first teaching. Within each subject area, ensure that through distinct key stage 3 and key stage 4 courses, knowledge gained throughout school is revisited and built upon with students being challenged in their thinking.
- Improve the behaviour and attitudes of all students through the implementation of a new behaviour policy, ensuring that bullying is rare and that those from disadvantaged backgrounds are attending school and have the opportunity to thrive and flourish.
- Build a strong culture and community across all areas of the school through the development of a family system whilst strengthening our student leadership, extracurricular and careers offers.
- Improve our engagement with parents through the development of new systems for communication (for example, the newsletter and a new website), the reintroduction of face-to-face parents' evenings and new parent forum meetings. We have also planned a series of rewards and celebration events for students across the school including a Key Stage 3 Graduation and Evening of the Arts in the summer term.

Aside from the above, during August 2023, our Estates Team worked hard to create a new SEND hub to aid young people across the school, including an enhanced offer to support young people's mental health and wellbeing (as featured in this newsletter). We have also created new department bases for Art and MFL, new science labs and, with the completion of the Humanities block for January 2024, the space vacated in the Caritas buildings will allow us to develop a new base for English too.

There is a lot to look forward to and be excited about as the school year progresses.
