GREETING FROM THE HEAD

To all members of our school community,

Welcome to the first ever edition of Hartbeat! This is our weekly newsletter where we can share everything that is happening in school with everyone in the community.

This week our students have returned to school and we have welcomed a number of brilliant new teachers.

We welcomed: Mr Thompson (Deputy Headteacher), who is leading on the quality of education provided to students in school and Mr Ingman (Assistant Headteacher), our strategic lead for DT, STEM and careers.

We are delighted to have appointed a new Head of English, Mr Spann and Lead Practitioner for English, Mrs Woolmer. STUDENT SUCCESSES!



A huge well done goes to HB in Year 8 who represented Wales and Borders in a number of events over the summer in the Pony Club sport of Tetrathlon. This involves the 4 disciplines of running, swimming, shooting and riding. The event takes place over 2 days. One day usually involves separate events of running 1000m, Swim for 2 minutes and shoot turning targets from 7m. Day two is a cross country ride on horse over 80cm fences. Points are awarded for each section with the cumulative points resulting in the placings.

Over the summer he has travelled, as part of the Welsh team, to Ireland, Scotland and England with the final event being the UK Pony Club Championships where he took the Stepping Stones (11 & under) Boys Championship. He now moves up to the Junior section (14 & under) which starts over the autumn with winter Triathlons (running 1500m, shooting 10m one handed and swimming for 3 minutes).

Another of our Year 8 students, Josh Sheldrick, undertook the very daunting task of abseiling St Mary's Church in Weaverham this summer, raising £80 for the church funds. Josh was understandably nervous, but faced his fears and completed a very impressive activity for a very worthy cause. Excellent, Josh!



Pharrell in Year 10 spent some of his summer in Germany, representing the UK in the Euro Finals in extreme stunt scootering, earning himself the opportunity to compete in the World Finals in Australia next month. What an incredible achievement!
